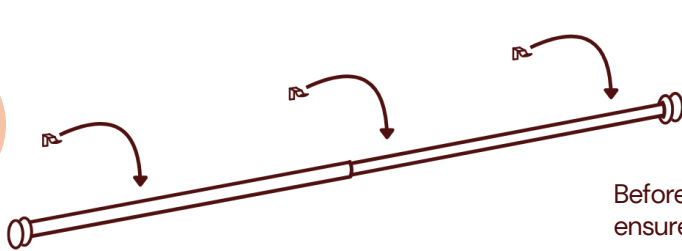


Installation Guide: Outdoor Curtains

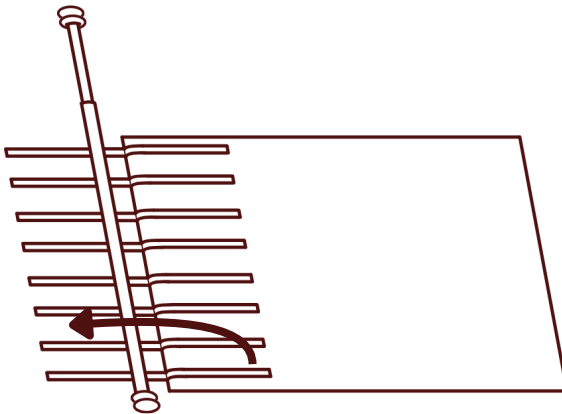

LEVEL 1 INSTALLATION

Before you begin installation of the curtain, please ensure you've installed your curtain rod.

TIE TOP CURTAINS

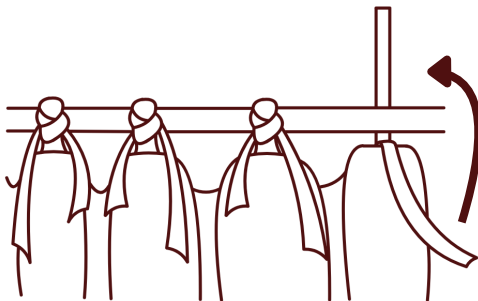

Fully lay out the curtain with the tabs split with half of them laid down flat and the other half laid against the curtain.

Take the curtain rod and set it on top of the tabs that are laid out flat, away from the curtain. Starting with the furthest left or right tab, start placing the tabs over the curtain rod and onto the opposite tabs.

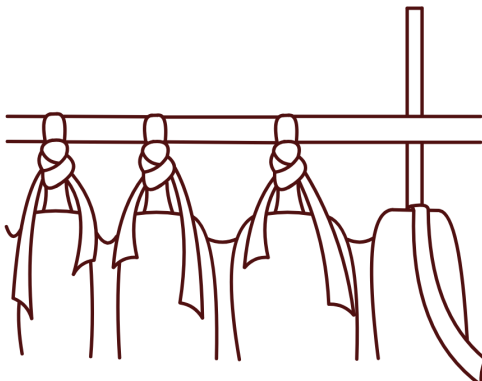

You have two options to tie off the tabs.

A) Tight tying: This would allow the shade to hang from the curtain rod as close as possible, ensuring more coverage when extended.

B) Tying the tabs loosely: This will have the shade hang further down from the rod, however, it will give the curtain a more decorative aesthetic.

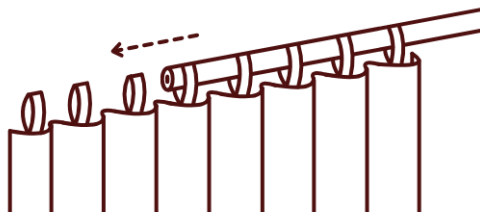


Both of these options have the option to tie the tab into a bow or into a double knot.

Double knots are a more secure hold and are great for high-traffic areas.

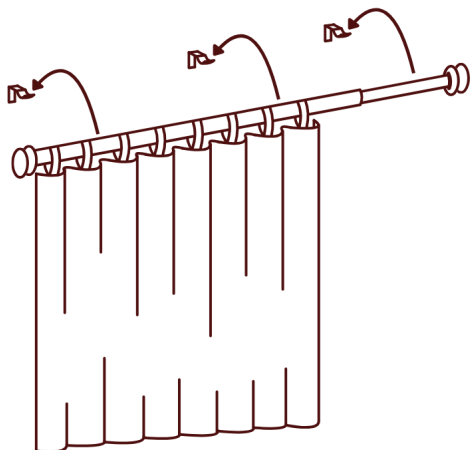
Take the whole rod and curtain and hang them back on the curtain rod brackets.

TOP TAB CURTAINS

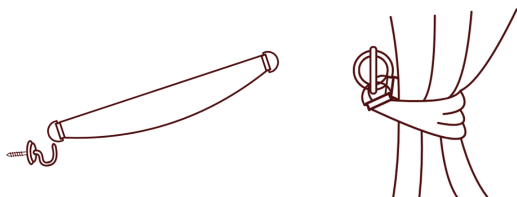
Thread the curtain rod through the top tabs ensuring you pass it through each one.

Once the curtain is fully on the rod, reinstall any hardware onto the curtain rod if there is any. Then reinstall the curtain rod onto the curtain rod brackets with the curtain attached.

TIE BACKS



Included with the curtains is a hook and tie backs. Install the hook on the wall near the window opening and hook one of the "D" shaped eyelets from the tie back. Then wrap the tie back around the curtain and hook the other "D" shaped eyelet. This will keep the curtain to the side when leaving the window open for view.

CLEANING INSTRUCTIONS

For regular maintenance, use a duster or a vacuum with a brush attachment and run it over the front and back of the shade.

To spot clean stains, use a damp rag with a very mild, gentle detergent or soap. Dab at the affected spots; DO NOT RUB! Let the dampened area air dry and repeat as necessary.

All fabrics are different and some may be easier to clean than others. We recommend cleaning your shades as often as once a month.
